Treasurer's Corner

DUES DUES DUES

Yes, it is that time, again. Dues from each club/society are due by December 15. December 15 is the magic date because we need to get your club report that accompanies the dues payment by that date in order to include your club information in the RMFMS 2008 Directory. If you are having officer elections in January, as some clubs do, please call or email me and we will see what we can do to get your new officer information in the directory.

Dues notices and forms will be sent to each club by email in mid-October where there is an email address available. Notices to other clubs will be by US mail. If you receive the dues notice but are no longer the treasurer or other officer, please forward it to your treasurer as requested in the notice. As explained on the form, we are requesting that you send in the annual reports using email if possible. Otherwise, use USPS. Just follow the directions on the form.

If your club does not receive the dues notice either by email or USPS, please contact me ASAP at 316-742-3746 or <gandpmaggard@wildblue.net> so that we can arrange to get your club information to me by the December 15 deadline. You can also access the dues form on the RMF website.

Dues from each club are determined by multiplying \$1.50 times each dues paying member age 12 or older in your club as of October 31, 2007. Clubs having family memberships should count each family member age 12 or older. Clubs wishing to be covered by the RMFMS arranged liability insurance should include payment of \$3 for each family/household in the club. This insurance is for club general liability coverage. Show, meeting place and field trip insurance can be purchased for an additional premium where you need to name an additional second party to the policy. The premium is normally \$50 and you need to use the special form and send it to our insurance chairman, **Arlene Burkhalter**, not me.

QUICK TIPS for EDITORS

and ask the readers for their answers.

Contest Time is Coming – What Are Judges Looking for in Bulletins?

Whatever the size of your bulletin it should fit the needs of your club. However, there are some things that apply to all bulletins, no matter the audience.

Appearance: Is it neat and readable? Have you included some illustrations? Will a club member be enticed to pick it up and read it? Is the name of your bulletin, issue date and page number on each page? Bulletins do not have to be done on a computer!

Club Information: Have you included your club name, purpose, list of officers, contact information, meeting time and place? Is the return address on the outside cover?

Reports: President's message? What is the program for the next meeting? How was the last month's program? What field trips are coming up? Are there any classes meeting? Minutes or a summary of the minutes of the last meeting should be included. Treasurer's report? If your club has restricted what you can put in your bulletin, just include a note explaining what they voted to restrict when you send in your entry.

Articles: Member written articles should be in each issue. So judges know an article was written by a club member, include an identifier with the author's name. For example: The Trouble with Fossils by Virgil Richards, Club Member. You can also follow the author's name with the acronym for your club (by Virgil Richards, TRMS).

When you use an exchange article be sure to include the author's name, the original source, the bulletin from which you have reprinted the article, and dates for both. An example: "The Trouble with Fossils" by Virgil Richards, TRMS. (From *T-Town Rockhound*, 8/05 via RMFMS Newsletter, 10/05). Notice the original source is the "from" and has the earliest date. The "via" is the bulletin you actually saw the article in and has the latest date.

Content: If your club is not a single specific study area in the earth sciences (i.e.: paleontology, minerals, faceting, etc.) try to include as wide a variety of subject areas as you can each month. Fossils, minerals, lapidary, club history, safety, member news, poetry, pending legislation that affects rockhounding, kids activities, coming events, websites of interest, and hints & tips are the usual suspects.

Federation News: Every issue should include RMFMS news and AFMS news. What counts? You can reprint an entire article from each or you can have another club member read the most recent newsletter of each and write a summary of the high points.

Spelling and Grammar: Using a computer? Use the spell check and grammar options that come with your word processing software. Then have someone else proofread for you! Computers cannot catch the type of misspellings where you mean "led" instead of "lead." Not using a computer? Ask someone else to proofread for you! After reading your own typing for long periods of time you simply cannot catch all typos.
